



In the Garden with Rick

SLUGGO

February Garden TasksFebruary can sometimes be a difficult month to actually be in the garden, as the weather may still be cold and wet in the Bay Area. At least it is a short month! There are, however, some essential tasks that should not be ignored. And don't forget Valentine's Day! Our garden centers have an abundance of blooming plants, including begonias, cyclamens, carnations, pansies and gerbera daisies in 4" starter pots for \$3.99 each—an ideal gift to show your affection year-round!

- ✓ Prune winter-flowering shrubs and vines just after blooming. Prune your summer-flowering shrubs, but be aware that spring bloomers already produced their buds last fall, and pruning them now will result in the loss of flowers. Deciduous trees should be pruned, too.
- ✓ Mid- to late-February is the time to fertilize shrubs and evergreens. Use an acid-type fertilizer to feed evergreens, conifers, broadleaf evergreens, rhododendrons, azaleas and camellias. Use an all-purpose fertilizer to feed roses and other deciduous trees and shrubs. Apply dormant spray (horticultural oil) to fruit trees to kill overwintering insect eggs.
- ✓ Keep after snails and slugs with Sluggo[®], which is safe to use around pets and wildlife. Available in assorted sizes including 1 pound (Sku 7117120, \$10.49) and 2½ pounds (Sku 7096258, \$18.99).
- ✓ House plants may notice the longer days and begin growing. You can begin feeding them again, but dilute your fertilizer mix by 50% until the growth is robust.
- ✓ Feed the birds so that they can help control insects once the weather warms up.
- ✓ Winter weeds should be pulled as they emerge. Oxalis and nutsedge should be dug out to remove their underground bulbs.
- Cymbidiums will be blooming now. Feed those that have not bloomed yet. Do not feed those currently blooming. Divide them after they have bloomed.
- Repot cacti and succulents (if they seem) too big for their pots) once they have finished blooming.
- Daffodils will be blooming. Remember not to cut off the tall green leaves from the bulb. These are needed to provide nutrients to next year's blooms.
- Fertilize bulbs just as their foliage begins to emerge. Bulbs blooming soon include tulips, daffodils, hyacinths and narcissus.

- ✔ Plant this month:
- Bare-root roses and fruit trees can still be planted.
- · Sow seeds for hardy springblooming annuals outdoors.
- · Warm-season annuals and vegetables and tender perennials can be sown indoors.
- Sow seeds and plant seedlings of cool-season or winter vegetables, including rhubarb, asparagus and artichokes.
- Gladiolas for spring or fall blooms can be planted now. Don't forget that gladiolas like rich, fast-draining (sandy) soil and lots of sun.
- Strawberries can be planted this month, too.

• Engineered wood. Made like plywood, several thin sheets of wood are glued together in a crisscross formation, topped with a hardwood veneer that can usually be refinished at least one to three times. So stable, you can install it virtually anywhere. Great for condominiums or

anywhere with excessive moisture concerns.

• Prefinished wood. Ready-to-install solid wood strips that come sanded, stained and finished from the factory. Available in ³/₄" solid wood and almost every species and color imaginable.

Laminate flooring is extremely impact and scratch resistant, but it is not real wood. Although extremely tough, laminates can be scratched by big dogs or dragging heavy objects across the

floor. Extremely stain resistant, these floors will not fade from ultraviolet sunlight.

Laminate flooring comes in three types:

- Glued floating floors. Special glue is applied manually to the tongue and grooves of each plank.
- Glueless floating floors. No glue needed—planks are designed to snap together, locking them in place.
- Preglued floating floors. The glue is applied

at the factory. Just moisten the plank tongue and insert into adjacent plank.

Trims and moldings are available for laminate floors. Moldings are laminated over a fiber core so they match the floor, or the moldings can also be made from real wood and color coordinate with the flooring.

Most laminate floors can be used anywhere within the home, including wet areas such as in a bathroom or kitchens. Laminate floors do not need a wax or polish. Most laminate floors



can be used over radiant heated concrete slabs.

Carpeting

For comfort, warmth and value, nothing feels softer or plusher on bare feet than a carpet. With a wide range of colors, thicknesses and textures available, carpeting is very easy to care for and is exceptionally durable, lasting a long time.

Vinyl

Most vinyl flooring will resist staining from normal household products, does not show scratches easily and is resistant to tearing, gouging, ripping and indentations.

The unique manufacturing processes used today can replicate the look and textures of real ceramic tile, stone and wood grains. Vinyl floors are manufactured in both sheet and tile. The vinyl sheet floors are offered in both 6-foot and 12-foot widths, and the vinyl tiles come in various sizes and thicknesses. Both types of vinyl flooring come in a wide array of patterns and colors.

The wear layer (the top layer) is critical to the performance of a vinyl floor. The thickness of the wear layer varies with each manufacturer's collection, or series, and is generally measured in mils. The thickness of a mil is about the same as a page in your telephone book. So a 10-mil wear layer would be comparable in thickness to about 10 pages.

- **Disinfectant:** The use of the term "disinfectant" is regulated by the EPA, and any products with this label must have undergone extensive testing of its germicidal properties.

- Boric acid: Canada and Japan have banned

this for use in cosmetics, but in can be found in many U.S. liquid laundry detergents. Scientific studies have shown that long-term exposure may disrupt the endocrine and reproductive systems.

Look for:

- Glycerin: A natural alcohol derived from sugar and also known as glycerol, glycerin naturally removes clothing stains and functions as a humectant for skin.
 - Thymol: A natural



Chinese Sausage Rice Dressing

Yield: 9 cups or 9–11 servings Preparation and cooking time: 1 hour

34 cup long-grain white rice

3/4 cup medium-grain white (pearl) rice

1/4 cup butter or margarine (1/8 lb.)

1 onion, peeled and chopped

1 cup chopped celery

½ cup chopped fresh cilantro

1 pound lop chong (Chinese) sausage cut into ¼-inch cubes

2 cans (8 oz. ea.) sliced water chestnuts, drained and chopped

1 cup chicken broth, fat-skimmed Salt and pepper

1. In a 2–3 quart pan, combine 2¼ cups water and both rice varieties. Bring to boil over high heat. Reduce heat to low; cover and simmer until rice is tender to bite, about 20 minutes. Fluff with a fork.

2. Meanwhile, in a 10–12 inch frying pan, over medium heat, cook butter, onion and celery, stirring often, until vegetables are limp, about 5 minutes.

3. In a large bowl, combine rice, onion mixture, sausage, water chestnuts and broth. Mix well and add salt and pepper to taste. Spoon into a shallow 2–3 quart casserole and cover tightly. (Chill if making one day ahead.)

4. Bake in 350°F oven until at least 150°F in center, 35–40 minutes or 55 minutes if chilled.




