Water Storage and Purification

(“Are You Ready” Series, Part 11)

The recent Rim Fire near Yosemite and San Francisco’s Hetch Hetchy Reservoir reminded us of how invaluable our water supply is. An adequate supply of water is one of the highest priorities of disaster preparedness. A major earthquake could damage the pipes that bring water into San Francisco, break water mains, or even break water lines leading into your building. After a disaster is not the time to search for water or water containers! Plan ahead.

Preparation

Responding to a major disaster will likely require heavy exertion. Plan on each person drinking 1 gallon of water each day. Add to this water for cooking and hygiene. Altogether, you should store enough water for 2 gallons per person per day. Expect and prepare to be without utilities from several days to several weeks—store 10–15 gallons of water per person.

Storage

Thoroughly clean sturdy 3- or 5-gallon water-storage containers with handles. Add about 4 drops of regular unscented household liquid bleach per

gallon of water (approximately 1 scant teaspoonful per 5 gallons of water). Use chlorine bleach with 5.25% sodium hypochlorite as its only active ingredient (such as Clorox). Seal containers tightly, date and label them as drinking water, and store in a cool, dark place that is likely to be accessible after a major earthquake. Pour out, clean, and refill water-storage containers at least once a year. (Clorox Bleach: Sku 1498674, \$3.49; 5-Gallon Water Jug: Sku 89149, \$21.99)

In an emergency, you may also be able to use the water stored in your water heater, your building’s plumbing system, or the reservoir tank of your toilet (not the bowl). Purify water from the toilet

reservoir tank before using. To access water in the plumbing system, open the highest water faucet in your home (to let air in), and then draw water from the lowest faucet.

Purification

The easiest methods are chemical purification using chlorine bleach or boiling. Use 2 drops of ordinary liquid bleach per quart of water (4 drops per quart if the water is cloudy). Shake and let stand for at least 30 minutes. Boiling water for 3 to 5 minutes should kill most harmful microorganisms. After boiling, pour water back and forth between two clean containers to improve the flavor by putting oxygen back into it.

Conserve—But Never Ration

Going even one day without water will severely deplete your strength and effectiveness. In a water shortage, refrain from watering plants or washing clothes, but don’t fail to stay well hydrated. If supplies are short, drink what you need and try to find more later.

Take steps now to prepare for the next major earthquake or other disaster.

over 40 years old! These furnaces are usually operating at only 50% efficiency and losing a lot of heat.

Older furnaces should be checked once a year for leaks.

Older furnaces should be checked once a year for leaks (cracks in the heat exchanger, the furnace's main component, can leak carbon monoxide), and the furnace filter should be changed every three to four months for maximum efficiency.

In the Garden November Garden Tasks

Tips from Dennis and Bill

During the late fall and holiday season, we tend to turn our focus to the indoors, but don't forget about the many tasks you can still undertake outdoors in the garden. Caring for your garden in the colder months of the year allows you to enjoy your garden year-round.

✓ Continue to plant spring bulbs that you purchased in the fall. Get them in the ground now, and they will reward your efforts in spring with beautiful blooms.



✓ This is a great time to plant new perennials in your garden. Throughout the winter, these newbies will really put effort in the root system, and they'll show off your planning and patience in the spring. Look around your neighborhood for plants that you remember admiring last spring, since these will be especially likely to do well in your area. If you don't know what a plant is, ask your neighbor! Or snap a photo to bring into our garden centers and we'll try to identify it for you.



✓ Plant primroses, cyclamen, calendulas, and pansies as well as cabbage, kale, broccoli, onion sets, and root vegetables. Sow seeds of arugula, bok choy, fava

beans, lettuce, radish, and spinach.

✓ With the holidays just around the corner, keep in mind that some holiday plants should be kept out of reach of children and pets. The most common plant in this category is the poinsettia because it is poisonous. A good resource for pet-safe indoor plants is the ASPCA website (aspc.org). If you are looking for a specific indoor plant, you can stop by any of our COLE HARDWARE stores, and we can usually locate and have the plant in stock within a week, depending on availability from our vendors.

✓ Ants might show up unexpectedly this month looking for a warm, dry home. Be prepared with some ant bait on hand. (Sku 7069057, \$4.99)



✓ If you don't already have them growing in your garden, consider buying rosemary, sage, marjoram, and thyme plants to have homegrown herbs on hand for your upcoming holiday meals. For an indoor herb garden, place herbs in a south-facing window.



✓ Clean up litter from fruit trees and roses and put it in your green waste bin. This will help prevent the spread of disease that can infect your plants in spring. Follow this cleanup with a dormant spray. Spray as soon as leaves start to fall for the first time. You can spray a second time in December and a third time in February. We have Monterey brand Liqui-Cop copper fungicide (Sku 7117112, \$12.99) and Safer Garden Fungicide (Sku 74806, \$9.99).



✓ During winter storms, dead or cracked branches could fall, doing damage to your home or to your neighbors'. Check your property and enlist the help of an arborist if needed to minimize these potential hazards.



✓ Help newer trees and shrubs stand strong through blustery weather by staking them. Use a lodge pole and keep it in place until roots are able to develop and anchor. (Sku 700509, \$8.49)

✓ Keep garden tools in shape by cleaning them off after use. Simply hose down and quickly brush off soil with a stiff brush. Occasionally give metal parts a "once over" with a wire brush and wipe to fend off rust. Treat aging wooden handles with linseed oil or varnish.



✓ Remember that plants don't need as much fertilizer or water during the winter, so both can be reduced now. This also helps harden your plants to weather the cold months ahead.

✓ Mulch all bare ground with bark or compost to help prevent erosion, smother winter weeds from germinating, and add nutrients to the soil as it decomposes.



✓ Don't forget about our flying friends. For a simple bird feeder to attract birds to your garden, spread peanut butter on a pinecone and sprinkle it with birdseed. An ideal activity for children on a rainy day, just hang these fun feeders with wire or yarn on a branch in the yard.

✓ Check drains around the house and remove leaves and debris from areas that could become clogged in the winter rain. As the rain begins, also watch for areas around your yard that pool and could become inundated with water. Modify the landscape or drainage as needed.

WHAT'S IN SEASON?



Enjoy Your Fireplace!

Winter will soon be here, and along with dropping temperatures, we can also expect soaring heating costs. Nothing is cozier than curling up next to a warm, crackling fire on a chilly Bay Area evening, and besides adding ambience, a fireplace can help heat your home, allowing you to forego turning on the furnace or plugging in space heaters.

Proper care and maintenance will allow you to enjoy the benefits of using your fireplace—not only safely, but also economically.

The U.S. Fire Administration (USFA) encourages you to practice the following fire safety steps to keep those home fires safely burning:

- Have your chimney or wood stove inspected and cleaned annually by a certified chimney specialist.
- Clear the area around the hearth of debris, decorations, and flammable materials.
- Leave glass doors open while burning a fire to ensure that the fire receives enough air to complete combustion and keep creosote from building up in the chimney.
- Most glass fireplace doors have a metal mesh screen that should be closed when the glass doors are open. This mesh screen helps keep embers from getting out of the fireplace. Always use a metal mesh screen with fireplaces that do not have a glass fireplace door.

- Install stovepipe thermometers to help monitor flue temperatures.
- Keep air inlets on wood stoves open, and never restrict air supply to fireplaces. Otherwise, you may cause creosote buildup that could lead to a chimney fire.
- Use fire-resistant materials on walls around wood stoves.

The Creosote Sweeping Log

When wood is burned in a fireplace, tar and creosote are formed. Creosote is unburned wood particles and condensed flue gases. With each fire, these highly flammable substances build up on the inside of the chimney and must be removed to prevent a fire. The Creosote Sweeping Log contains a mixture of minerals that are dispersed during burning to coat and adhere to the creosote. The creosote then becomes brittle and breaks away over the following two weeks. The patented Creosote Sweeping Log is an alternative to mechanical cleaning and is one of the fastest, easiest, and most cost-efficient ways to clean your chimney. (Sku 4192415, \$16.99)



Coffee Fire Log

Clean, dry, well-seasoned hardwoods, such as oak or maple, are the best woods to burn, as they produce less smoke and provide more heat energy than softer woods. The density of hardwoods also allows them to burn more slowly and evenly. Cooking Oils 101

Choosing the right oils for your everyday or holiday meals is key to obtaining healthy and delicious results. While oils high in saturated fats are better avoided, and oils high in omega-3 and omega-6 fatty acids are generally considered healthier, portion control—as difficult as it might seem during the holidays—is still just as important.

The shelves at your local grocers offer a plethora of oil types these days, giving you seemingly unlimited choices. But you'll need to take into consideration what you are cooking and the oil's smoke point, or the temperature at which flavor and nutritional degradation will occur.

Olive oil: The darling of the gourmet food industry, olive oil is key to a Mediterranean diet, with properties that can lower bad LDL cholesterol and raise good HDL cholesterol levels.

Suited for: All-purpose cooking, light sautéing

Smoke point: 375°F–465°F

Grape seed oil: Popular due to its mild, unobtrusive flavor, grape seed oil is generally light in color with a mild, nutty taste.

Suited for: Baking, roasting, broiling, stir-frying

Smoke point: 420°F



Safflower and sunflower oils: The two flowers that produce these oils are closely related, and the interchangeable oil is extracted from their seeds. With very little flavor, these oils are relatively low in saturated fat.

Suited for: Everyday cooking, searing, browning, deep frying

Smoke point: 225°F–510°F

Canola oil: Fairly new on the market in terms of oils, canola oil comes from the rapeseed of Canada, and the name is an acronym for CANadian Oil, Low Acid. It has a mild flavor.

Suited for: Baking, roasting, broiling, stir-frying

Smoke point: 425°F–450°F

Corn oil: Dominating American pantries for generations, corn oil, despite its mild flavor, high smoke point, and low cost, has fallen out of favor as other oils have emerged in the marketplace.

Suited for: Light sautéing, sauces, low-heat baking

Smoke point: 450°F

Peanut oil: An excellent source of concentrated protein, peanut oil is the “olive oil” of

Asia. Technically, the peanut is a legume and not a nut. It possesses a mild flavor.

Suited for: Deep frying, stir-frying

Smoke point: 320°F–440°F

Sesame oil: A healthy choice for cooking and salad dressings compared to other oils, use of sesame oil dates back centuries.

Suited for: Light sautéing, sauces, low-heat baking

Smoke point: 350°F–450°F

Avocado oil: One of the newer oils on the market, avocado oil's high smoke point and mild flavor make it an excellent option for frying.

Suited for: Searing, browning, deep frying

Smoke point: 420°F–520°F

NOTE: Smoke points of oils vary depending on the oil's level of refinement. The more refined an oil is, the higher the smoke point. Refining oils removes impurities that cause the smoking. In general, the lighter in color an oil is, the higher the smoke point. Also, the longer an oil is exposed to heat, the lower its smoke point will become.



Winterize Your Home: Save Money and Energy!

In the winter, a large portion of a household energy budget is consumed by heating costs. This is especially true in San Francisco, where the charm and character of our beloved Victorians often translates to “cold and drafty.” That’s why it’s important to check your home to make sure your heating dollars are not going to waste.

You should have no problem undertaking many of the following do-it-yourself tasks, but if you are unsure about any of them, don’t hesitate to contact our Repair Referral Service for a qualified tradesperson to assist you.

Window Insulation Films

Estimated energy loss for U.S. consumers through residential and commercial windows is over 25 billion dollars a year—a loss comparable to the value of the oil delivered by the Alaskan pipeline, or 5% of the total U.S. annual energy use.

Window insulation kits allow you to easily install a clear film to seal out air drafts and create a dead-air space between the film and the window surface. Just use a hair dryer to heat the film to shrink to fit your window. Available in assorted sizes to cover from 18 square feet to 108 square feet. (Sku 59829, \$5.99; Sku 59902, \$12.99)



Weather Stripping and Caulking

Improperly sealed homes can waste 10% to 15% of your heat. The following are probably the least expensive, simplest, and most effective ways to cut down on energy waste in the winter:

- Check around doors and windows for leaks and drafts. Add weather stripping, and caulk any holes you see that allow heat to escape. Make



- Every duct, wire, or pipe that penetrates a wall or ceiling or floor has the potential to waste energy. Plumbing vents can be especially bad since they begin below the floor and go all the way through the roof. Seal them all with weather stripping or caulking.
- Electric wall plugs and switches can allow cold air in. Install pre-cut foam gaskets that fit behind the switch plates and effectively prevent leaks.



Examine Your Heating Ducts

Check heating ducts for leaks. Think of the ductwork as huge hoses, bringing hot air instead of water into a building. Mostly out of sight, ducts can leak for years without anyone knowing. They can become torn or crushed and flattened. Old duct tape will dry up and fall away over



time, which allows junctions and splices to open, leaking heated air into an attic or under the house.

(Metal-reinforced or foil-backed tape should be used instead of duct tape.) Roughly 10% of a heating bill can be saved by preventing leaky ducts.

Close the Damper on Your Fireplace

The fireplace damper obviously needs to be open if a fire is burning, but if it’s open when you’re not using the fireplace, the chimney is functioning as a large open window that draws warm air out of the room and creates a draft.

Check Your Insulation

Insulate your attic or crawl space:

- In an older home, this can be the most cost-efficient way to cut heating bills. Before energy-efficiency standards, homes were often built with little or no insulation. As a result, large amounts of heat can be lost through walls, floors, and—since heat rises—especially ceilings. Insulate the attic hatch or door, too.
- Seal holes in the attic that lead down into the house, such as open wall tops and duct, plumbing, or electrical runs. Cover and seal them with spray foam and rigid foam board if necessary.

Inspect Your Heating System

- Get a routine maintenance and inspection of your heating system each autumn to make sure it is in good working order.
- Replace your heater’s air filter every three to four months.
- Clean and remove dust from vents and along baseboard heaters.



Programmable Thermostats

With the onset of winter and cold weather, a programmable thermostat, capable of dividing days into multiple time zones, allows you to adjust the temperature level according to your needs. For example, at night you can turn it way down, program it to have the house warmed when you wake up, and set the temperature during the day depending on whether you’ll be home or at work. These thermostats are easy to install and save energy and money. Remember, it takes less energy to warm a cool home than to maintain a warm temperature all day long.



Light and Motion Sensors

An energy-efficient way to make sure entryways are lit when arriving home during dark hours is to install an automatic light sensor that will turn on at dusk and off at dawn.



Motion-activated lighting, which turns on when movement is sensed, is another alternative to welcome guests, secure your home, and save energy. COLE HARDWARE offers a variety of light- and motion-sensing options.



Gutter Maintenance

Clogged gutters and downspouts can be worse than none at all. It’s best to check and clean your gutters and downspouts twice a year: in the spring after the winter rains and in the fall before the next rainy season. If big trees are near, clean gutters more often.

All you need to get started is a ladder, work gloves, a bucket, a garden hose, and motivation.



Galvanized gutters are sturdy enough to lean a ladder against, but aluminum gutters are not. When in doubt, use a step ladder or stabilizer. Make sure the ladder is absolutely safe before you climb it!

With a gloved hand, reach into the gutter and sweep it for debris. Put it in a bucket and haul it down or simply drop the debris on the ground to clean up later. When you think you’ve got a stretch of gutter clean, hook up the garden hose and run a hefty volume of water through the whole system. This will flush out anything that is remaining as well as let you know if the downspout is working.

As you are cleaning, keep an eye out for areas that may need repair. COLE HARDWARE carries a full assortment of caulk and patching materials. Performing repairs in wet weather is not just a drag for you—it also limits your choice of repair materials. So be sure to do your cleaning when there is dry weather on the horizon.

Time Change Reminder

Sunday, November 3

Clocks are moved one hour back this year on Sunday, November 3, at 2:00 am. If you set your clocks back on Saturday night, November 2, before you go to bed, you'll awake Sunday morning to the correct time. While this means we gain a precious hour of sleep, it also means that it gets darker an hour earlier.

Well-lighted entryways help prevent accidents, as well as discourage would-be burglars. Motion-activated lighting turns on when movement is sensed and saves energy. Both decorative and floodlight styles are available, and many models feature a sensitivity control to adjust the range of distance for sensing motion and to select the length of time the light stays on after motion has been detected. Winter Spare the Air



The Winter Spare the Air program notifies Bay Area residents when fine particulate, or soot, levels are anticipated to be unhealthy. In the wintertime, particulate matter—especially particulate matter 2.5 microns

or smaller in size, also known as PM2.5—can become a serious problem in the region. To protect public health, the Bay Area Air Quality Management District will issue a Winter Spare the Air Alert when PM2.5 concentrations are expected to be unhealthy.

From November 1 through the end of February, under the Air District's wood-burning regulation, when a Winter Spare the Air Alert has been called, burning wood, fire logs, pellets, or any other solid fuels in your fireplace, woodstove, or other wood-burning device is illegal.

When wood burning is allowed, residents who do burn in a fireplace or outdoor fire pit must still burn cleanly using dry, seasoned firewood and not burn

garbage, leaves, or other material that would cause excessive smoke. Residents who exceed the excess visible smoke provision in the wood-burning rule could be subject to a ticket.




